

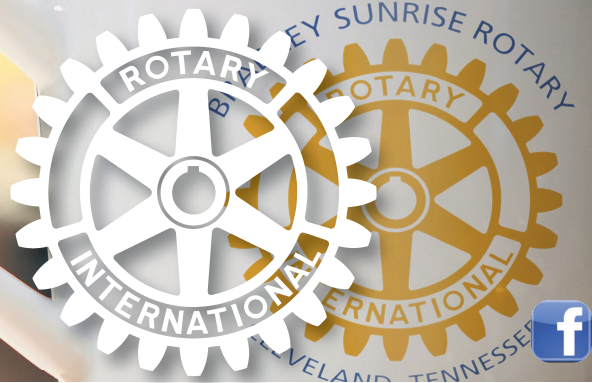

How to Drive in Atlanta

You must first learn to pronounce the city name Atlanta. Old timers are still allowed to call it Alana.

The morning rush hour is from 5 a.m. to Noon. The evening rush hour is from Noon to 7 p.m. Friday's rush hour starts on Thursday morning.

The minimum acceptable speed on I-285 is 85 mph. On I-75 and I-85, your speed is expected to at least match the highway number. Anything less is considered "Wussy."

Forget the traffic rules you learned elsewhere. Atlanta has its own version of traffic rules. For example, Ferraris and Lamborghinis owned by sports stars go first at a four-way stop. Cars/trucks with the loudest muffler go second. The trucks with the biggest tires go third. The HOV lanes are really designed for the slow Floridians passing through who are used to hogging the left lane everywhere else.

If you actually stop at a yellow light or stop sign, you will be rear ended, cussed out and possibly shot. Unless there is a police car nearby.

Never honk at anyone. Ever. Seriously. It's another offense that can get you shot.

Road construction is continuous and permanent. Detour barrels are moved around for your entertainment pleasure during the middle of the night to make the next day's driving a bit more exciting. Generally city roads other than the main streets have more potholes and bumps (usually speed bumps) than most dirt roads in the countryside.

Watch carefully for road hazards such as drunks, ladders, possums, skunks, dogs, barrels, cones, furniture, cats, mattresses, shredded tires, squirrels, rabbits and crows.

Be aware that spelling of street names may change from block to block. i.e. Clairmont, Claremont, Clairmonte.

If someone actually has their turn signal on, wave them to the shoulder immediately to let them know it has been "accidentally activated."

If you are in the left lane and only driving 75 mph in a 55-65 mph zone, you are considered a road hazard and will be "flipped off" accordingly. If you return the flip, you will be shot.

MOST IMPORTANT: If you get LOST, look for a road named PEACHTREE. . . . Then you are somewhere in Atlanta.
